LETTER TO PARISHIONERS

Sunday, 31st May 2020

Pentecost: We celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, described in chapter 2 of the Acts of the Apostles. This is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. Today, we are that community of believers. The disciples were gathered, hidden away, fearful, uncertain as to what was going to happen next. Then the Holy Spirit works in them, on them and through them. They go out, they preach, and miracles take place. Pope Francis often encourages today's Catholics to be open to the gift of boldness that marked the early Christian community. So, as we emerge from lockdown, let us pray we may be open to receive the Holy Spirit and, no longer timorous, emerge to take up our place in society.

Re-opening: At present we have no date for when our church will re-open. When we do, the details will be placed on the parish website, holyredeemerchelsea.com, under "Newsletters". It is likely that for an initial period the church will be open only for personal individual prayer. Also, there is talk of Marriages being allowed with a very small congregation. However it could be some weeks before parishioners can attend Mass. In the meantime we are preparing by purchasing necessary items such as sanitiser, and planning how and where the congregation will take their places in church. I will be asking for volunteers to help us enable the celebration of Mass in a way which is respectful, not only of God, but also of the vulnerability of his creation.
