POPE FRANCIS IN IRAQ

If everything goes according to plan, Pope Francis is in Iraq this weekend. Friday afternoon is when he is scheduled to arrive in Baghdad and begin his stay with a courtesy visit to the President. Then he goes to meet other groups at the Syro-Catholic Cathedral. (Fact: there are at least five cathedrals in Baghdad, an indication of the role Christianity has played through the centuries in Iraq.) Saturday sees him visit the Shia Grand Ayatollah in Najaf, pray in the Plain of Ur and return to the capital to celebrate Mass in the Chaldean Cathedral. Sunday finds him in Kurdistan: visiting war-torn Mosul and Erbil, as well as the persecuted Christians of Qaraqosh. Let us pray that on Monday evening he will touch down at Rome's Ciampino airport, a tired traveller but safe.

LENT

A call to Prayer is clearly at the heart of the message of Lent. Jesus himself went out into the desert to pray. One way we can make space for prayer is to spend less time on, fast from, amusements such Computer, Video and TV. In Lent we think, not only of ourselves, but rather of seeing how we can help those around us, whether in London or in the global village. While not every person can volunteer to help, we can all make some gift, no matter how small, to help others.

STATION OF THE CROSS

In Lent our attention turns, like that of the disciples (Mt 20.18), to Jerusalem. At Easter, Jerusalem is the setting for the greatest drama in the history of mankind since the Creation. Not surprisingly it was the first centre for Christian pilgrimage, but for a variety of reasons it was always inaccessible to many. So devotion took the form of following in the footsteps of Jesus, not in the crowded streets of the Old City, but in Church.
