Starting Tuesday 16 April at 6.30pm, there will be a series of evening meetings with a time for prayer and talks and discussion about the Catholic faith. These meetings, in the Monckton Room, are particularly suitable for adults preparing for Confirmation, but all are welcome to come along.

PRIEST TRAINING FUND

Next Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, the day we pray for priests and for vocations to the priesthood. The annual collection for the Priest Training Fund (formerly known as WEEF) will take place next weekend. This fund pays for the formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 49 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 13 of whom are from this Diocese. There is also have one seminarian for Westminster at the college in Valladolid and one at the Beda College in Rome, who is presently on pastoral placement in Ruislip. Last year 3 deacons were ordained for Westminster Diocese. The Priest Training Fund also supports the ongoing enrichment and formation of our ordained priests. Your generous donations help us support these men who are called to be like Christ the Good Shepherd. Donation envelopes are available in the back of the church. Nearly half of Glass Door's guests are aged between 18 and 35, signalling a rise in homelessness among young people. The night shelters close during the summer, but Glass Door's work helping people to find a route out of homelessness goes on.
