Be alert for hidden motives. Boys often commit faults through thoughtlessness. At other times there are hidden motives for their misbehaviour. On several occasions I have called some troublesome lads to order and, on inquiring with kindness why they persisted in being stubborn and self-willed, received as an answer, "That teacher has it in for me!" or "They're always picking on me, so I'm giving them something to pick about!"

To my surprise, I have found that such explanations were not always without foundation. Often - I hate to admit it - we ourselves are partly to blame for the misbehaviour of our pupils.

Strange to say, those very teachers who are most exacting and who refuse to overlook even the slightest disobedience, are often the very first to ignore the advice of their own superiors. They themselves will forgive nothing, but they expect any fault of theirs to be entirely overlooked.

Speak kindly. When the pupil is convinced that his superiors have high hopes for him, he is drawn back again to the practice of virtue. A kind word or a glance does more to encourage a child than a severe reprimand, which only serves to dampen youthful enthusiasm. (St John Bosco, 1815 - 1888)
