Saturday 22nd February: THE CHAIR OF ST PETER THE APOSTLE

Each year, on 22nd February, the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of the Chair of St Peter the Apostle. To celebrate the feast "of a chair" sounds rather strange. However, in this case the chair is a symbol of the primacy and authority, the role of leader, which Jesus entrusted to St Peter (Mt 16.16). His successors, the popes, have remained a source of unity and strength for the whole Church. Really it is the mission and office of the Pope which are being celebrated and honoured. Among all the bishops of the Church, the Pope has this particular primacy and authority, symbolized in the form of a massive monumental chair, to be found on the rear wall inside the Basilica of St Peter in Rome. It was sculpted in bronze by the artist Gian Lorenzo Bernini in the seventeenth century. Within that giant sculpture is a reliquary for what is traditionally believed to have been the original chair or "cathedra" of St Peter. What is of true importance is not so much the physical chair, but what is symbolized: the ongoing service rendered to the Church by successive popes, from St Peter to Pope Francis. The Pope is called "the servant of the servants of God" because of this service he gives the worldwide Catholic Church, his leadership. Let us pray for Pope Francis and all who assist him in seeking to give a clear and consistent witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
