ALMSGIVING

The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. During Lent, we are asked to focus more intently on "Almsgiving," which means donating money or goods to the poor and performing other acts of charity. As one of the three pillars of Lenten practice, along with Prayer and Fasting,, Almsgiving is "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God." (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 2462).

There are several special opportunities for Almsgiving through donations to charities for which collections are conducted during the Lenten season including CAFOD, The Cardinal's Lenten Appeal and the Holy Places.

Furthermore, there are countless other ways to offer your time, talent and treasure to needy individuals and organizations during Lent and throughout the year. For ideas look at the websites of Glass Door (glassdoor.org.uk), CARITAS (caritaswestminster.org.uk) or the SVP (svp.org.uk).
