CORONAVIRUS COVID 19

Last week, in his announcement on behalf of the Catholic bishops of England and Wales, Cardinal Vincent Nichols stated: "It is very clear that, following official advice and in order to keep each other safe, save lives and support the NHS, at this time we must not gather for public acts of worship in our churches. This will begin from Friday evening, 20th March 2020, until further notice."

For us this means there will be no congregational worship in our church as long as the COVID 19 crisis continues. In his statement the Cardinal goes on to make clear that in the current situation there is no obligation to attend church on Sunday. Nevertheless, many people will still wish to visit the church to pray. For this reason our church will be open more or less as normal, from 8.00am to 6.00pm. At all times we are all asked to remember the advice we have received to maintain a certain distance from one another.

I would be grateful if you would pass this message on to anyone you know who attends Holy Redeemer. This message is also available on the parish website, under the heading "Newsletters", In addition, there is a list of churches from which Mass is streamed live. Alternatively, one can access Vatican Media or EWTN TV.

Let us all pray for one another, for those who are ill and the people caring for them. Furthermore, we should pray for the doctors and scientists working to find a cure, and we must not forget the men and women trying to keep everything running in these difficult days. Let us hope for an end to the crisis and look forward to being able to meet again giving thanks to God for all his blessings.

CARDINAL'S LENTEN APPEAL

DAY OF PRAYER

The Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Sexual Abuse will be marked this year on Friday, 3 April. This is a day when we think about and pray for all those impacted directly by abuse – for the victims themselves at the heart of our prayer, their families, friends, and communities. The traumatic effects of sexual abuse cause a person to experience in mind, body and spirit all sorts of long-lasting conflicts and struggles -it can be like a battlefield in the body. Very clearly in the Gospel, Jesus stands with all victims, and calls us to co-responsibility in responding to their pain. When one part of the 'Body of Christ', the Church, is hurting, everyone is aware and affected. Everyone can do something towards alleviating that pain. Pope Francis says the Church must be like a field hospital in battle, ready to respond, ready to heal the wounds.

LOURDES PILGRIMAGE

Given the COVID 19 crisis, difficulties in travel and the closure of the baths in Lourdes, the Westminster Diocese Pilgrimage to Lourdes will not go ahead this year.
