

BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS – We give thanks for the Beautification of Carlo Acutis which took place in Assisi on 10<sup>th</sup> October. Blessed Carlo was born in London in 1991 of Italian parents, and baptized at Our Lady of Dolours, Fulham Road. At the time his father was working for a merchant bank in the City, but the family returned to Italy before he went to school. As a teenager he set up a website dedicated to miracles of the Holy Eucharist (miracolieacarisici.org), and had the idea for an exhibition on that theme which visited thousands of parishes. All this activity was a fruit of his great devotion to Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, which he called his "highway to heaven" (autostrada per il cielo). His life was cut short by leukemia, and he died in 2006. In his life he had sought to imitate the example of Our Lady, St Bernadette, St Francis and other saints. Now he is set before us as an example of a life lived in Christ every hour of every day. Let us pray his life will inspire other young people to follow Christ.

**QR CODE** – The posters in the church porch with a matrix barcode, an array of black and white squares, display our QR (Quick Response) code. In combination with the NHS app, this code works as part of the Test and Trace system for combatting the spread of the coronavirus Covid 19. Those with the NHS app on their phones may prefer to use this rather than contacting the Parish Office.

FR JOSEPH ARCHIBONG – During the coming weeks, you may well see a new face on the sanctuary of Holy Redeemer. Fr Joe is a priest, a member of the St Patrick Missionary Society (aka Kiltegan Fathers). He was born at Calabar in Nigeria and started training when he was 22. After his Novitiate in Nigeria, he studied Philosophy in South Africa and Theology in Kenya. Ordained priest in 2007, his first appointment was in the Turkana Desert in Kenya. After some formation studies in Ireland he worked in a seminary, training future priests, from 2011 to 2017. He came to this country to raise money for the missions, but is unable to do that work during the present Covid crisis. He is particularly happy to come to

our parish, as he has known about our local hero, St Thomas More, since he saw the classic film "A Man for All Seasons".

READINGS AT MASS: Some people miss being able to read the Scripture texts during Mass, whether during the Liturgy of the Word or as a reflection after Holy Communion. Those of you with access to the internet may wish to find them at universalis.com. In the present circumstances, it is most acceptable to use phones or tablets in church, but only to access the readings, prayers, meditations etc.

COMING TO MASS: Parishioners are kindly requested to notify in advance the Parish Administrator saying which Mass they wish to attend. If you have not been doing this, please start. We need to maintain the flow of people entering church, avoiding queues, or social distancing becomes a problem. However, if you cannot contact the Parish Office, you are still most welcome to come to Mass, though on arrival you will be

asked to give your name and contact number/email address or use the QR code.
