Sunday 3rd February: 4th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Parish Mass Book page 133)

Tuesday 5th St Agatha, Virgin Martyr. In 251 AD, this young Sicilian woman was tortured, but she refused to deny her faith in Christ and so she was executed. She is the patron saint of breast cancer patients.

Wednesday 6th St Paul Miki. A wealthy young man, he gave up power and privilege to become one of the first Japanese Jesuits. During a persecution of the Christian community in 1597 he was executed along with 25 others in Nagasaki, now the city with the largest Catholic population in Japan. Before his most painful death, he insisted that he forgave his persecutors and that he was truly Japanese.

Friday 8th St Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan, enslaved and sold many times, horrendously tortured, but later she was baptised and became a nun in Italy. She forgave those who hurt her, seeing them as unwittingly helping her to become a Christian and a nun. She is the patron saint of trafficked women.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF THE EUCHARIST
