Sunday 9th June: PENTECOST SUNDAY (Parish Mass Book page 294)

Monday 10th June: The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church

The occurrence of this celebration of "Maria Mater Ecclesiae" on the day following Pentecost is a reminder of the close bond that existed between Our Lord's mother and the disciples who had become his new family, the Church, and of how she was, and remains, a focal point of the life of Christians.

Tuesday 11th June: St Barnabas. This early Christian was one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to Acts 4:36, Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Named an apostle, he and St Paul undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against those who wished to impose Jewish traditions. His missionary work in Asia Minor ended, he died in Cyprus and is venerated as the patron saint of peacemakers.

Thursday 13th June: Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest. On this day we celebrate the ongoing priestly role of the Risen and Ascended Christ, who leads us in our worship as he celebrates the everlasting liturgy offered by the Church triumphant, all the angels and saints in heaven.

He helps them to grow in love and reverence for God, and teaches them to discern right from wrong and to act with integrity.
